

<u>Blencarn</u>

Blencarn's first recorded spelling was the same as now, in 1159. Blen is Old Welsh blean, 'hilltop' (as is cairn) "a heap of stones" cairn, so at its start c.2,0000 years ago it had a cairn/buriel? waymark?) on its long ridge.

In time the long low ridge was settled as a village now its narrow green, nicely placed to see raiders coming.

By 1790 it had 24 heads of families of the lord of the manor, and 11 more as tenants of the Adertons (kin to the Pattensons). Those bound to the lord of the manor had to do his ploughing, mowing, raking hay, and reaping, free, as part of their rent. In 1792 their lord died and his Will ordered that all 35 farms be converted to freehold free of charge to the sitting tenants.

The Common of Culgaith was divided up into fields in 1773, and 100 acres allotted to the School at Blencarn Gate (now called Howrigg) erected in 1775, to pay for its masters, he, to teach, free, any child from Culgaith or Blencarn. The path to it across the wild wet moor from Culgaith is still there, as is the path from Blencarn. In 1794, the 100 acres were let for £42 pa, which paid the School's costs and salary. Few children went, in practice; the farmers kept them at work at home.

In 1870, the Education Act was passed requiring all children to go to school. In 1878, Blencarn's opened, in the village. In its wall was the letter box (by 1901) cleared daily at 4.30. Blencarn had a grocer, joiner, blacksmith, builder, tool maker and carrier and 11 farmers in 1901.
