Dear Friends.

I recently enjoyed a visit to the Rheged Centre to see the exhibition in the gallery of the work of award-winning book illustrator Jackie Morris. I was particularly drawn to a section showing her work on a book called "Lost Words". The story behind the book goes back to 2015, when publishers brought out a new updated edition of the Oxford Children's Dictionary. A number of new words had been included, reflecting the modern age in which we live, such as blog, chatroom, ipad and broadband. In order to make room for these new words, some other words had necessarily been substituted out. The words that no longer had a place in the dictionary included acorn, buttercup and conker. Jackie Morris's illustrations for the book "Lost Words" celebrates these words that had been left out.

Many of us believe that there is a God whose thought originally brought creation into being. This planet, then, belongs to God, and we as human beings are entrusted with its care. We need to "Tread Gently", looking after the beautiful world God created and set into being. I wonder how we are getting on with that responsibility. And I wonder exactly how much we have lost over the years - not just words from a children's dictionary, but whole species of plants and animals.

As we approach Harvest Time at the end of September, let us all be reminded to do our part in caring for and looking after God's wonderful creation. Remember: "Reduce, Reuse, Recycle"!

Thanks to everyone who supports the 100 Club, especially the lady who bought a number on the day to make the total up to £116 for the village hall funds. Unfortunately, only 98 numbers were sold this month.

#### Hunsonby and Winskill

By 1829 these two were a united township, part of the large ancient parish of Addingham. The first written record of both is in 1292, in a serious crime case in Cumberland Assizes. Hunsonby was settled by the Norse farmers from Ireland who came up the Eden settling on its banks, or near it.

### Hunsonby and Winskill Cont'd

Its place name means 'Farm - Village where the hounds' keepers live'. Winskill was 'Wyndscales' in 1292 i.e. originally the houses for summer use only (Norse farmers), for keeping an eye on their sheep etc. when grazing there. Later, in land-shortage, the 13th century being fine and warm and peaceful ('til 1296) and the local population grew, these Summer-only houses became all-year on their windy ridges.

Two outlying farmers settled nearby, both Norsemen. One was Farmann at Farmanby, first mentioned c.1190, and the other was Robert, a Frenchman (the Normans), whose family had invaded northern France as Vikings. Robberby was there by c.1237. The villages of Hunsonby and Winskill may have arrived then too. Winskill's ridge was Hunsonby's summer grazing. In 1829, Robberby was a hamlet of several houses.

In 1726, Mr.Joseph Hutchinson, a local, gave Hunsonby school 50 acres of land, to be let, its income paying for schooling for the poor's children of Hunsonby and Winskill. He also left his land in Winskill and £10 cash to the poor there, i.e. its interest to be paid them. By 1829, the school's land was at Gawtree, and was let for £40 p.a.; his Winskill land was let for £55-5-0 p.a. (£1 then was a large sum). Addingham's open school was at Maughanby.

Mr. Thomas Hall, c.1823, built a small Methodist Chapel at Hunsonby at his own expense. He was a farmer. There were two farmers in the township in 1829 called Thomas Hall, one at Hunsonby, the other at Robberby. Both were yeoman, i.e. owned their land. Hunsonby had two pubs, The Crown and Thistle (i.e. England and Scotland), William Richardson licensee, and The Cross Keys, John Lancaster licensee. The school's master was Joseph Lancaster, Hunsonby. Another Lancaster in Hunsonby, William, was the cartwright (new and repairs).

### Hunsonby and Winskill Cont'd

There were seven farmers (four were yeoman); two at Robberby, four at Winskill. The blacksmith, Thomas Lancaster and the glazier, William Watson, were at Winskill. Nearest carriers called at Langwathby.

Population of Hunsonby and Winskill: 117 - 1801; 113 - 1811; 151 - 1821. Any destitute were paid for by the township.

# Pitfalls in Translation

# Minutes of the Annual General Meeting of the Guardians of Culgaith Tarn - June 24th 2024

The chair of the committee, Kate Pontin, thanked members for all their hard work in the past year. Particular thanks were extended to the treasurer, secretary and vice-chair. Vicki Cawley, who joined the committee last year, was thanked for her service and for her advice and expertise on matters horticultural.

The highlight of the year was the second plant fest. The weather was perfect, people were generous with plant donations and in their spending. Dalefoot composts donated compost and Margaret, from Hope's Garage, Langwathby, brought hanging baskets and plants to sell. The final sum raised was £1800 which will help enormously with the ongoing costs related to the maintenance of the area. The Vic café also donated £100 towards the event.

The next event is planned for Saturday - October 5th, an exhibition of photography of The Tarn, taken by local photographers at different times of the year. This event will be co-ordinated by Elliot Lee. Photographs can be sent to: Safeandlocks@live.co.uk. At the same event there will be a sale of Autumn bulbs, and refreshments will be available,

The treasurer's report and financial statement shows a balance of  $\pounds 4043.30$  at 31/05/24. A copy of the report is available on request if required.

Some lessons for the future were learned, as is often the case with a new event. The auctioning of some donated items needs better management. In order to avoid disappointment, it was also felt that a card payment facility would be a significant improvement and help to alleviate the problems with cash. This will be looked into in terms of viability - it would certainly help if it is possible.

It was also pointed out that the signage on the Langwathby - Culgaith road did not explain the location of the Tarn, which will be rectified next year.


