CULGAI TH

Culgaith's first mention in writing is in 1140 or so, and is an old Welsh place-name meaning "a wood in a remote place", with or without houses. Old Welsh was spoken all over Cumbria before the Normans came in the 11th century. In Kirkandrews Wood in Culgaith was St Andrews Hermitage in 1140; it was there in 1344, but lapsed when its hermit moved to Hutton in the Forest.

In the time of Henry First (late 12th century) Culgaith's Lord of the Manor was Adam Swainson (in those days known as FitzSweyn, which means the same thing - "son of Sweyn") who had no sons, and only two daughters, both of whom married and their husbands jointly became its lords.

One of them built Culgaith Church to save himself and his villagers the trouble of going to Kirkland every Sunday in all weathers. It was rebuilt in 1756, being by then decrepit. It had its own burial-ground by then. In the 1450s it had mid-week services (the Mass) which lapsed by 1456 and the Pope set up a group to find out why and report back.

In the 1730s, the curate's pay was only £6 a year (about £1500 today) and he had to run a private school to make ends meet. In 1869 a new porch, vestry and east window were added, and in 1879 it became a parish in its own right. Its curate was now the vicar with better pay and higher status. The Methodist Chapel dates from the early 19th century.

In 1775 the land-owners of Culgaith and Blencarn built and funded the school which in 1876 was superseded by today's one, built for £650 (about £650,000 today) by local voluntary rates. In 1901, it had 70 pupils (today, 50 pupils).

Culgaith marked the 1897 Jubilee (Queen Victoria's) by building a Reading Room: public libraries had not yet been instigated.

The Midland Railway passes under The Pea in a 660-yards tunnel.

Fascinating Facts about July

- July was referred to as **Quintilis, the fifth month of the season.** **After the addition of January and February in 450 BC,** July got the seventh position. The name was later changed to **Julius in honour of Julius Caesar.**

THE GENERAL ELECTION WILL TAKE PLACE ON THURSDAY 4TH JULY 2024

This will be the first General Election at which you will need an Identification Document to be permitted to vote. Without it, you will be turned away. YOUR POLLING CARD IS NOT ACCEPTABLE.

Be aware that acceptable I.D. is not the same for all voters. For example, an Older Person's Bus Pass is acceptable BUT a Student's Bus Pass is NOT ACCEPTABLE.

Photo I.D. you'll need

You'll need to show photo I.D. when voting in person in UK parliamentary elections, including general elections and by-elections.

Check if you have accepted photo I.D.

The photo I.D. you show must be the original version. You cannot use a photograph, image on a phone or a photocopy of your I.D.

You'll need one of the following types of photo I.D. to vote:

- a UK or Northern Ireland photocard driving licence (full or provisional)
- a driving licence issued by an EU country, Norway, Iceland, Liechtenstein, the Isle of Man or any of the Channel Islands
- a UK passport
- a passport issued by an EU country, Norway, Iceland, Liechtenstein or a Commonwealth country
- a PASS card (National Proof of Age Standards Scheme)
- a Blue Badge
- a biometric residence permit (BRP)
- a Defence Identity Card (MOD form 90)
- a national identity card issued by the EU, Norway, Iceland or Liechtenstein
- a Northern Ireland Electoral Identity Card
- a Voter Authority Certificate
- an Anonymous Elector's Document

You can also use one of the following travel passes as photo I.D. when you vote:

- an older person's bus pass
- a disabled person's bus pass
- an Oyster 60+ card
- a Freedom Pass
- a Scottish National Entitlement Card (NEC)
- a 60 and Over Welsh Concessionary Travel Card
- a Disabled Person's Welsh Concessionary Travel Card
- a Northern Ireland concessionary travel pass

The photo on your I.D. must look like you. You can still use your I.D. even if it has expired.

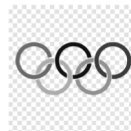
