





#### **CULGAITH**

\*\*\*\*\*\*\*

Culgaith's first mention was in the 1140s. It is from the Old Welsh for "Wooded Corner". It was one of the four townships of the Parish of Kirkland whose rector saw to services in its chapel mid-week and on Sundays. But by the 1450s the rector ignored Culgaith and the locals complained to the Pope who, in 1456, got the Bishop to act and get the services going again.

The church was decrepit 300 years later and was rebuilt with money from three large bequests and by local subscription. It was consecrated by the Bishop in 1758. Work on it must have been slow or hit by delays as it says "1756" over the door.

Culgaith's lands included Kirkandrews Wood which was described as "a fine banksy wood on the east of Culgaith Park". There was St Andrews Hermitage in it, owned by Wetheral Priory in the 1140s. The hermit left it because of the noisy hunting parties in Culgaith Park and went to Hutton-in-the-Forest, where Forest Law would prevent any expansion. This wood overlooks the path to Newbiggin from Acorn Bank.

Millrigg may conceal a pele tower. The house was rebuilt in 1597 and revamped in 1669. The Wesleyan Chapel was built in 1830.

The station (1880) is the only one on the Settle-Carlisle line of non-standard design. In 1922 it had 5 trains a day each direction. Near it in the 1880s were the Vale of Eden Creamery and the Culgaith Tilery for making the tiles required for field-drains. In the late 19th century Jim Huddart was Bandmaster of the Culgaith Brass Band which was much in demand locally.

Thanks to Jeremy Godwin for his research and article as he begins his 51st year of contributing to the MEMO.





# Little Free Library Under The Lime Tree "Take a book, share a book"

Around the world, in 115 countries, millions of books are exchanged through a network known as Little Free Libraries.



The newest addition to the 150,000 registered libraries is here in the Eden Valley. In the heart of the fellside village of Glassonby, adjacent to the children's playground, a Little Free Library has been built to provide a sharing place for books of all genres.

Inspired by Glassonby resident and author Veronika Robinson, and built by her near neighbour, Fred Harrison, in the past few weeks the library has already seen many exchanges. Acting as the steward, Veronika hopes this small and friendly feature in the village will encourage other residents to freely give and receive books. Unlike traditional libraries, there's no 'return due date' (or late fees!); nor is there a requirement to even return the book. Instead, readers are encouraged to share books of their own so that the spirit of giving continues. Glassonby's Little Free Library is also open to readers from beyond the parish.

Words from the opening ceremony blessing: "Welcome Little Free Library under the Lime Tree. May you serve this village as a portal into other worlds. May they be places of wisdom, insight, intrigue, revelation, creativity, hope, justice and laughter. Around your door, may we gather in companionship, conversation and community."

One thing that many winter holidays have in common is a focus on togetherness, gratitude, and community. So, in the spirit of this time of year, we thought we'd celebrate the diversity of the festive season.

Harditonally, it takes place in late November or early December, and commonity religious celebrations, the Maccabean revolt — when Jews fought for their religious freedom against the Greek-Syrian army in ancient Jerusalem. Like many religious celebrations, the holiday is based around the story of a miracle. Around 160 B.C, Israel was under the rule of Antiochus III the Great, who outlawed the practice of Judaism, and forced the Jewish population to worship the Greek gods. On his orders, the Jewish Holy Temple was desecrated and rededicated to Zeus.

After a number of years of revolt, the vastly outnumbered Jewish forces eventually won against their oppressors. Once the Jews had started to rebuild their most sacred temple, they lit the menorah — a seven-armed golden candelabre.

The story goes that there was very little oil remaining in the menorah — just enough for one day. However, according to legend, the menorah burned for eight full nights before going out. For this reason, Hanukkah is celebrated over a period of eight days beginning on the 25th day of Kislev in the Hebrew calendar. Last year, Hanukkah began on the 7th December and ended on 15th December.

Yule celebrated on the winter solstice — the shortest day of the year, 21st December 2024 — Yule is one of the oldest known festivals observed at this time of year.

Yule was originally celebrated by the Pagan and Norse people of Northern Europe, and is still celebrated by the Pagan and Wiccan communities today.

The original celebration was tied to worshipping the sun, and honoured the rebirth of life and the year. As the ancient Norse believed the sun to be a wheel upon which the seasons turned, they would ward off the darkness of the winter months by drinking, lighting bonfires, and sharing tales.
