What will you be doing in Lent?

The 5th March is the start of the season of Lent this year. What if anything will we give up this Lent?

For the early Christians, fasting was a part of everyday life, not just in Lent, but on every Wednesday and Friday outside the Easter and Christmas seasons. I remember as a child thinking that giving something up was a great idea and decided to give up homework but that didn't go down well at school. Personally I think it's more positive to 'take something up', such as attending a Lent course or some spiritual reading to enhance our knowledge, or caring for the environment looking in on neighbours volunteering or perhaps changing unhealthy habits... if not for the whole of Lent, then especially between Ash Wednesday and Holy Saturday. Lent is a good time to stretch ourselves and try something new. Whatever we do, it is easy to miss the point of the tradition, it is so easy to take all that God gives us for granted, unless we make time to stop, pause, and think which is what Lent is all about.

Our lives are so full of daily distractions that we find it difficult to pause and to rediscover what it means to be a child of God, made in God's image. Making the effort to give up or take up something, helps us to focus on what's important.....what things we might stop doing in order to begin something new; or perhaps to rediscover old and good practices that we've forgotten. In that way, Lent can indeed be a chance for God to prompt us to 'take something up' so perhaps a personal note to ourselves on Ash Wednesday is to reflect and decide what it is we are going to do. Then we have 40 days for God to help us to work at it.

BLENCARN

In the beginning was the ridge where Blencarn Village now stands. An old Roman road known as Maiden Way once ran nearby and 1.27 km northeast near the farm of Ranbeck lie various ancient "cultivation terraces" known as "The Hanging Walls of Mark Antony". There is a cairn on the ridge, which must have been a prominent local landmark or it wouldn't have had a placename. Its place-namers were locals who spoke Old Welsh in the years after the Romans left. Their word for a ridge or hilltop was "blaen", which in Cumberland has become "blen" or "blin".

Blencarn's first mention is in 1159, when it was spelled "Blencarn" even then. It had become a surname by 1429, when at least one Blencarn man had gone to Yorkshire, where he was called William Blenkarn. He had grown rich and became a Freeman of the City of York. Variants include Blenkhorn and Blenkiron.

Blencarn was grouped with Kirkland where the church was. (The first known priest was put there in 1294.) Its soil is a strong clay. In the 1770s there were 53 tenants here under the jurisdiction of four landlords. They got their fuel from the coalpits at Arndale Head or from peat from the fell. By 1794 they had improved their grassland fields with local lime and were now breeding horses for sale to the gentry for their carriages, riding, etc, and got good prices.

In 1840 the local Methodists built their chapel on the back road to Milburn. The school in the 18th century was in the farmyard at Howrigg and served Culgaith too. (Culgaith's pupils had a long walk over the moor.) However, in practice few went. In 1870 the Education Act compelled all children to be schooled. Blencarn's School Board (ie five local farmers) built the school on the street, which opened in 1878 for 40 pupils. Howrigg reverted to being a farm only. The Blencarn letter-box was in the school wall by 1901, and was cleared at 1.30pm Monday to Friday.

Sunday 30th March, 10.30am - Café Church, an informal worship service including light refreshments.

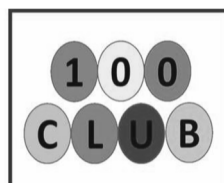
